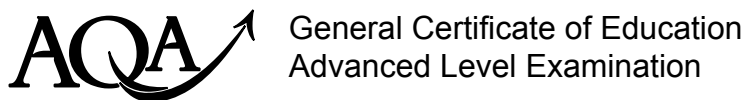

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Texts E and **F** are recipes for curry taken from two cookery books.

- **Text E** is from *The Art of Cookery made Plain and Easy* by Hannah Glass. It was published in 1747 and gives the first known English recipes for Indian food.
- **Text F** is from *Meals in Minutes* by Ainsley Harriott and was published in 1998.

By reference to **both** texts and to ideas from language study, describe and comment on what these texts show about the development of language and style over time.

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Texts G and **H** are both advertisements for cars.

- **Text G** is an advertisement by Morris Motors from 1952.
- **Text H** is an advertisement by The Austin Motor Export Corporation Ltd from 1962.

By reference to **both** texts and to ideas from language study, write about what these texts show about changes to language and style over time.
